If you scored mostly 1s your Primary Design Style is:

Traditional

You like classic looks that never go out of style. You enjoy traditional details such as scrolls, damask patterns and beautiful moldings. You probably like the history behind a style and knowing that something has a timeless effect. You also enjoy the richness and depth of pattern and textures mixed together, and are drawn to a layered look with many interesting objects to explore in a space.

If you scored mostly 2s your Primary Design Style is:

You might enjoy entertaining and having a space that works well for gatherings including martinis or champagne! You might explore your second and third styles (the next ones where you had the most numbers) to add some casual comfort to balance your elegant style.

If you scored mostly 3s your Primary Design Style is:

Vintage

Your interior design style is artistic, collected, travelled, and interesting. You probably love antiques and fabulous vintage finds, and have a talent in putting pieces together. You probably enjoy a casual Bohemian vibe and value comfortable relaxed living. This style is down to earth yet there's an elegance in this look—think French model—an effortless elegance.

You might explore your second and third styles (the next ones where you had the most numbers) to be sure that your space retains a classic look or modern simplicity. And you might occasionally edit your collections, remembering that sometimes less is more. And most importantly continue to have fun pulling vintage looks together!



Scoring Continued

If you scored mostly 4s your Primary Design Style is:

Modern

You're attracted to the clean lines and crisp unadorned look of a modern style. You don't like your interiors to look too busy, overly patterned or textured, or cluttered. Your look is sophisticated and chic. As Da Vinci said, "Simplicity is the ultimate sophistication." You might love abstract art and how so much is expressed with so little content. You find a streamlined look to be soothing and tranquil.

You might enjoy the simplicity of form and honesty of materials in styles including Shaker and Arts and Crafts. Mid-Century Modern and Scandinavian looks are up your ally. Industrial looks may appeal to you when they're done in a clean modern style. You might explore your second and third styles (the next ones where you had the most numbers) to add some additional character and depth to your spaces.

If you scored mostly 5s your Primary Design Style is:

Rustic

The rustic look is typically associated with country design, although today it works great in any space, from country farmhouse to modern urban loft. You love an organic look using real materials in as close to their original state as possible. You're attracted to the homey feeling and nostalgia that a rustic look provides. You also like your spaces to be practical and comfortable.

You might also like Industrial looks with rough hewn metals. Also look into farmhouse, cottage, and French Country styles to see where your rustic look goes. You might explore your second and third styles (the next ones where you had the most numbers) to add a contemporary vibe to your space and make it your own.

If you got equal numbers your Primary Design Style is:

Eclectic

An eclectic style is a combination of several styles. You can combine as many styles as you'd like as long as there's a cohesive color palette. Read through the other styles to see which appeal the most to you and try to focus on your top two or three just so that it doesn't become too overwhelming. An eclectic style is fabulous because your spaces will be interesting and unique to you. Your space won't look like it came right out of a catalogue or off a showroom floor, and will have a lot of personality.
